Dear Young Emergency Doctor, Nurse, Paramedic, Student, Would you like to...

... speak at the biggest international emergency medicine conference in Europe?
... experience fantastic speakers and emergency specialists from all over the world?
... get exposed and be known in the vibrant European emergency medicine scene?
... be supported with travel and hotel costs as well as free conference entrance?

So use this unique chance and be part of EUSEM 2022 in the spectacular city of Berlin!

For that you just have to be a young doctor, nurse, paramedic or student and/or talk about a topic relevant to young doctors in emergency medicine.

Also, you should...

... be ready to take over one or two talks and one moderation obligation.
... send us your topic suggestions. If you have an idea for a special format / way how to present, please send us these ideas too.
... be OK with us streaming and/or recording and publishing the lecture worldwide (in special cases e.g. unpublished results parts of lectures can be not streamed / recorded)

We really encourage young and motivated speakers who are not perfect, but enthusiastic about their topic to apply. Whether you should apply or not, just do it!

The open call lasts from January 6 until February 15, 2022.

The topics are not fixed. If you need ideas or inspiration, please look through these broad topics and ideas:

- **‘Doing the basics right’** (sometimes the basics are most important - tell us how and where we can improve)
- **‘Once in a lifetime’** (critical situations that might happen rarely but could be life- threatening)
- **‘So small but so dangerous’** (paediatric horror stories- who is not scared of our little patients)
- **‘Tips and tricks nobody told us’** (interesting things you haven’t paid attention to while reading medicine books but turned out to be important)
- **‘Terrorism and armed conflict’** (experiences in conflict / terror scenarios, prevention and planning, toxicology in special circumstances)
- **‘Stop bullying in emergency medicine’**

- **‘How to read, write and present’** (talking about presentation skills, novel teaching concepts / ideas, reading and writing scientific literature; also how to motivate young EMDs in research)
- **‘Young Leadership’** (being a young doctor in a leadership role is challenging, talking about dealing with a crisis)
- **‘Surviving in...’** (Unique experiences in remote, wilderness, nautical, aviation medicine...)
- **‘Critical Skills’** (what skills are important and how can they be learnt or taught)
- **‘Wellbeing’** (how can we not only survive, but thrive in emergency medicine as a lifelong career?...)
- **‘Limited resources’** (how emergency medicine is practiced far from the high- income countries. What are the unique challenges and solutions we can all learn from?)
- **‘Innovative Concepts’** (Did you / your department / organization develop a unique or innovative concept to further emergency medicine? Show it to us, so we all can learn from you!)
- **If you have a very interesting topic that does not fit any of the above, doesn’t matter, please explain your idea and its relevance in a few short sentences!**

In the email you are sending us please include ALL of the following:

- A short CV
- Picture of you (can be included in the CV)
- Contents / titles for your suggested talks (please suggest at least 2 talks!), explain your talk in a few concise sentences
- Name the topic where your talks would fit in (choose from the list or name your own)
- Either a video of one of your previous talks or a PDF or slides from one of your previous talks.

That’s it! We would love for you to apply - simply send us a quick email with the above information to yemdsection@eusem.org.

If you have any questions, email us - anytime.

If you are unsure about the presentation style - we want both quality of content and a good visual presentation. Some inspirations could be **‘TED-Talks’**, a medically oriented talk by the fabulous Cliff Reid: „Getting Things Done“ (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=PXAMICwQAYY>).

The foremost criteria for selection are quality and content of the talk, therefore we urge you to send us some sort of example of one of your previous talks (see above).

To promote equality, we especially encourage women and speakers from less wealthy countries to apply.

Please spread the word among your colleagues and together we will create an original and outstanding scientific YEMD track.
