The Paediatric Emergency Medicine: Children in need for Resuscitation and Assessment for Serious illness or injuries in Hospital settings ("CRASH") course


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Concept

Children in need for urgent and emergency care present to emergency departments across Europe. There is increasing interest in developing the skills and competencies in providing paediatric emergency medicine (PEM), and PEM is now a recognised specialty in several countries, such as the United States, Australia, Israel and the United Kingdom. There is now also an established European training curriculum. As many European countries lack specialist training in PEM, this small group intimate course aims to provide state of the art insight in PEM by an expert faculty. This course will focus on recent evidence based developments in PEM, and developing and refining PEM related practical skills and competencies, in line with the European training curriculum.

Target audience

Any paediatric or emergency medicine clinician dealing with the acutely unwell child, at any level of training or post qualification as medical specialist. We would recommend this course in particular for senior (paediatric and EM) trainees, early stage consultants or more established consultants who want to refresh or update their paediatric emergency medicine knowledge and skills.

This course is also intended for advanced (independent practising) nurse practitioners.

We encourage anyone with an interest in this course but unsure about their suitability to contact our faculty to enquire about the set up and contents of the course.

The course is accessible for delegates from any country; with the emphasis that we will focus on the skills and competencies required for western health care settings. At present, we can't financially support delegates from LMIC.

At registration, we will enquire about level of experience to tailor the course to every participant's level.

Airport to Lake Bled:

Lake Bled is located a short 34 km away from Ljubljana International Airport. Ljubljana International Airport is the nearest airport to Lake Bled, and you have two transportation options to get there; you can either take a taxi or private transfer or you can take the Avtobusna Postaja bus. Taking a Ljubljana airport taxi or private transfer is the fastest and only direct way to reach Lake Bled, getting you to your destination in just 30 minutes. Alternatively, you can take the public bus, with a bus transfer in Kranj. The total travel time takes around 1 hour.

City centre to Lake Bled: The main bus station is located in the capital city of Slovenia, Ljubljana. Main bus station is also located near the main train station.

There may direct bus (approximately 1 hr) and train connections (up to two hours). See for example here:
